

	Term	Definition
	UCAS	Universities and Colleges Admissions Service. Centralised system to apply for university in the UK.
	Tariff points	The system for allocating points to the different qualifications you can get. Also called UCAS points.
	Deferral	This is where you postpone your place to start in the following academic year.
	Conditional offer	Where you are offered a place on a course subject to a specified condition e.g. BBB at A Level.
•	Unconditional offer	Where you are offered a place on a course without any conditions.

	Term	Definition
	Extra	A service to apply for alternative places if you do not hold an offer from your first five choices.
	Firm	A offer you accept as your 1 <sup>st</sup> choice.
A	Insurance	An offer you accept as your 2 <sup>nd</sup> choice, in case you don't meet the conditions of your firm choice.
	Clearing	A service to look for alternative courses. If you didn't get a place on a course it allows you to apply for courses that still have vacancies.
	Adjustment	A service to look for alternative courses if you exceeded your conditions.


	Application stage	Additional information
	Register	To sign up to UCAS you need to register by providing personal details such as name, date of birth, address and agreeing to the terms and conditions.
2	Personal details	Provide additional details such as nationality, residential status and your school reference number.
Ñ	Additional information	Provide equality monitoring details and information regarding higher education preparation activities you have taken part in such as summer schools.
	Student finance	Confirm how you intent to pay for your studies (e.g. apply for student finance)
	Choices	Input your you 5 course choices.

Application stage	Additional information
Education	Input your past qualifications and predicted grades.
Employment	Add information regarding any paid employment you have undertaken.
Personal Statement	This is your chance to sell yourself to a university and demonstrate within 4,000 characters (or 47 lines) why you are a good candidate for the course.
Reference	Provide the details of your reference (often a staff member at your school or college). They will receive an e-mail and complete a reference for you.
Pay and send	Your final chance to review the application, agree to the terms of use and pay £24 for your application to be sent.
Help & options	A section at the end of the application to provide you with additional support and information.


